October Positive Change: Bloomingfoods Cooperative Community Fund

In the month of October, Bloomingfoods shoppers gave \$8,353.33 for the Bloomingfoods Cooperative Community Fund. These funds will be paid into an endowment that focuses on cooperative development in our region. The more Bloomingfoods participates in the endowment, the more investment income we receive in return. The Bloomingfoods Cooperative Community Fund Committee then chooses a local non-profit organization to receive a \$1000 annual gift paid by the investment income we receive.

Positive Change raises funds by giving shoppers the opportunity to round their purchase up to the nearest dollar, or donate more if they wish. Each month, Bloomingfoods has a new recipient organization, and 100% of the proceeds go directly to the organization.

The campaign continues at all three Bloomingfoods locations. This month, the co-op is raising funds for <u>Mother Hubbard's Cupboard</u>.



Mother Hubbard's Cupboard exists to ensure that all people have access to healthy, whole foods and to provide opportunities to build self-reliance. Their programs include a client-choice food pantry and free educational programs on nutrition and gardening.

You can now save money by shopping more sustainably! Pick up a stamp booklet at any location and receive stamps for sustainable shopping habits. Once you've filled the booklet, redeem it for \$5 off your purchase!

How to get your stamps:

- Bring your own reusable bag
- Reuse a cardboard box
- Refill a container/use your own bulk containers
- Pay with cash
- · Walk, bus, or bike to the store

\$5 off not stackable with other discounts and not eligible for gift card purchase, equity payments, beer & wine, or \$3 dinners. Maximum 1 stamp for each activity, 5 stamps total per day.







The Exciting World of Shelf Tags! Tony Alongi, General Manager



Ever stay up at night and think about shelf tags at your favorite co-op? We do! It's an incredibly important piece of laminated paper that never gets any attention. And they are pretty much the same wherever you go. Small, hard to read, with a mysterious bar code that means nothing to anyone other than a few grocery people.

We are about to change all of that! Over the next few months (between now and year-end) our shelf tags are going to undergo a complete re-do, making them infinitely more useful to you. In addition to making the price larger and more legible, the new shelf tags will help you identify the product's attributes at a glance in the form of "bugs." No, not those kind of bugs, but little color coded circles with an indicator in it. Looking for non-GMO product? Look for the red bug with a white NG in it. Gluten Free? That would be a yellow bug with a black GF in it. All in all there are 17 possible attributes for products that will be listed and each tag will list all of the attributes for that product. The full list of attributes and bugs can be seen above.

Why are we doing this? Because we are committed to giving Bloomingfoods shoppers as much transparency as possible on the products you are purchasing. So let's give the lowly shelf tag another chance! We hope you enjoy this little additional bit of transparency in your food shopping experience.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the election and congratulations to our newest board members! We had a lovely annual meeting with an inspiring talk by guest speaker Jacqueline Hannah about the impact Bloomingfoods has had on the national cooperative movement. She reminded us of the awesome work we have done supporting other food co-ops through trainings, mentorship, and simply serving as an inspiration. She highlighted how our focus on local products has enabled the creation of food businesses and farms in our community. And she pointed out that even now we are innovating, introducing a grocery delivery service before anyone else in the region. We may not be the only place to buy organic tofu anymore but we are still relevant and we are still important.

Bloomingfoods has often struggled to tell our own story effectively. However, it is essential that we rebuild our identity and our appeal. We need more shoppers, more owner-members, and more sales. The board will be looking at how to tell our story in a way to attract new faces, which is key to our survival. It's not just the history of how Bloomingfoods was created and what we have done over the years. It's all the personal stories of people who have shopped, worked, volunteered, sold to, met friends at, and learned from Bloomingfoods. So I invite you to ask yourself this question: Why does Bloomingfoods matter to you?
